July is going to be a very "different" month this year. Usually, July means water ice and barbeque. We look forward to celebrating Shark Week (July 11-18) with "Jaws" and The Blob Fest (July 14-16). This July, the Center will look more like "Bob the Builder". Thanks to the Chester County Commissioners and Department of Economic Development we are replacing aging HVAC systems that don't meet COVID recommendations for outside and filtered air. PA Rep Melissa Shusterman secured funding with PA Department of Economic Development for improvements

to electrical distribution system to keep up with growing demand. (Remember, Thomas Edison was 8 years old when this building was built!)

These long-awaited HVAC and electrical upgrades are scheduled to start this month. The contractor has much of the equipment with the rest scheduled to arrive shortly. They are starting to do some of the prep work which includes pouring concrete slabs outside and running wires and hoses.

What does this mean to you? We cannot commit exactly when these will happen and some may happen at the same time. Please check our website, Facebook page and the auto attendant message on our main line for scheduling updates and changes.

- 1. Parking lot The west driveway will be closed for a time as they install two outside units at the front corner of the building. There will be a new fenced enclosure around that equipment which means parking changes on that side. Contractors will need access to the outside units all around the building which may impact parking. This may include handicapped spaces on both sides of the building.
- 2. Food Service changes We will serve breakfast and lunch on the second floor starting July 10. This includes our Third Thursday Beach Blanket Bingo. Until work is complete breakfast will be served on Tuesdays and Thursdays only. There will be limited coffee hour starting July 10 until work in the dining room is complete.
- 3. The electrical upgrades will require power to be shut off to the entire building for a time. Current plans are to complete that work over one of the last two weekends in July. Activities will be cancelled if for some reason we do not have power to the building.

We appreciate your patience during this difficult time. Please remember this is only temporary and we will have a better, safer Center at the end of this construction.

I have one last favor to ask, totally unrelated to the building. If you are unable to let us know you won't be coming, please make sure those close to you contact us here at the center. All too often, someone will have a health crisis that keeps them from coming in, that puts them in the hospital or rehab, or worse. The staff and your friends here at the Center worry when we don't see you. An update is greatly appreciated. Staff will share only the information you and your trusted circle want us to share.





Here is a list of some of the available programs with their gross monthly income limits for a one-person household and asset/resource limits where applicable:

Senior Center Breakfast and Lunch Programs-can cut your weekly food bills.

PACE/PACENET – helps to save money on prescription medication costs (PACE: \$1,208/PACENET: \$2,792)

LIS/Extra Help with Medicare Part D – helps with monthly premiums, annual deductibles, and co-payments (\$1,843, assets: \$16,660)

Medicare Savings Program – helps pay Medicare premiums, deductibles, coinsurance, and copayments depending on level of assistance (\$1,660, assets: \$9,090)

Medical Assistance – Medicaid for those with Medicare (\$1,235, assets: \$2,000)

LIHEAP – home energy assistance (\$1,698)

SNAP – supplemental nutrition assistance (\$2,430 for seniors)

Property Tax/Rent Rebate – rebate for property taxes or rental costs (income limits vary)

Senior Food Box – supplemental canned and dry goods (\$2,430)

pennsylvania
DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

This program benefits Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers age 50 and older; and people with disabilities age 18 and older. The yearly income limit is \$35,000 for homeowners and \$15,000 for renters; however, only half of your Social Security income counts. The deadline was extended to Dec 31st and the maximum rebate is \$650. Did You Know?

PACE/PACENET is Pennsylvania's State Pharmaceutical program and it can help with your prescription drug costs. Unlike many programs, assets (such as savings) aren't considered to determine eligibility, so if your gross income is less than \$2,792/month, you might qualify for this great program!

Do you know what other program doesn't look at assets? If you said **SNAP**, you're right! Seniors in Pennsylvania with gross incomes less than \$2,147/month qualify for SNAP regardless of savings and other resources. If you have significant medical expenses, you might qualify even if your income is higher.
