Everyone seems to have a lot of different questions. If you have more questions, please come to the Quarterly Participants Meeting on Thursday, March 7 at 10:00. I will be happy to hear about them then.

Parking:

Do I have to pay to park in the senior center lot?

Not during your visits to the building. The signs asking for a parking donation are for after hours. If you are going downtown at night or on the weekends, a small donation (we suggest \$5) is appreciated. You can use the QR code on the sign or give a donation to the center. During working hours (M-F, 8 am to 3 pm) please find a different place to park if you are not coming to the Center.

- Q. The only time I come to the center is to get my income taxes done. Why are you asking me to park in the municipal lot next door?
- A. On any given day, the center's parking lot can be completely full. During income tax season, the demand can double for parking with preparers and people arriving early or staying late for their appointments. Regular attendees who come for multiple activities over several hours have priority. Average time for a tax appointment is 90 minutes or less which costs \$3.
- Q. Can I park along the west side of the building?
- **A.** Yes, that area was only restricted during construction this fall. Feel free to park in any free spaces.

TAX PREPARATION & ASSISTANCE



We have a limited number of AARP tax appointments available.

To schedule, please leave a clear message for Cari at **610-935-1515 ext 24** with your name, the name of anyone

filing with you, your phone number, and the reason for your call. She will return your call to schedule your appointment in the order your message is received. Please be patient as call volume is high.

Appointments continue through April 11th,

If you are coming in just for a tax appointment, please park in the Borough lot next to the Senior Center. Cost for 1 1/2 hours is \$3. Please bring exact change.



Important Changes to the Pennsylvania Property Tax/ Rent Rebate Program New Income Limits!

Starting in 2024, the new yearly income limit will be \$45,000 for renters and homeowners; however, only half of your Social Security income counts. If you file your taxes with our **AARP Tax-Aide team, you can apply for your Property Tax or Rent Rebate at the same time.** If you think you qualify, please let Cari know when you call to schedule your tax appointment. This program benefits Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers age 50 and older; and people with disabilities age 18 and older.

Questions about Medicare? We can help!

PA MEDI Counselors are specially trained to answer your questions about Medicare and provide you with objective, easy-to-understand information about health insurance. Specifically, we can help answer your questions about Medicare, prescription drug plans, Medicare Supplement Insurance (Medigap), Medicaid, and Medicare Savings Plans. Additionally, your counselor will screen you to see if you qualify for any programs to help with costs.



PA MEDI Counselors do not sell Medicare products but rather offer current, unbiased Medicare education to help you make the most informed choices about the Medicare options available to you.
