Summer hours start. We close at 1pm on Fridays

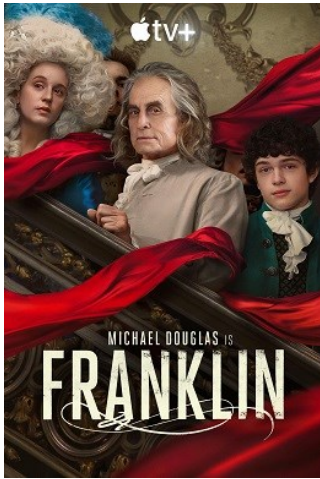

**PENNSYLVANIA SENIOR FARMERS MARKET NUTRITION PROGRAM (SFMNP)  
2024 CHECK DISTRIBUTION**

CCDAS will be distributing SFMNP checks through the U.S. Mail beginning May 15th 2024 following receipt, review and acceptance of 2024 Application Form.

Seniors who are 60+ years old during the program year or will turn 60 by December 31, 2024 and meet the income requirements are eligible for SFMNP. Income is total income including interest, Social Security, wages, etc.

**Income Guidelines**

Income is determined by household. All members of the household are to be considered. A household is a group of related or non-related individuals who are living together as one economic unit.

**2024 Household Income Eligibility**

1 person - \$27,861	5 people - \$67,673
2 people - \$37,814	6 people - \$77,626
3 people - \$47,767	7 people - \$87,579
4 people - \$57,720	8 people - \$97,532
